AWARDS:

For multiple contributions in the improvement of health care delivery: the College of Physicians and Surgeons and Saskatchewan Medical Association jointly awarded Dr. K. Kumar the **“Quality Improvement Award”** in October 1996, the **“Certificate of Appreciation”** by the Hospitals of Regina Foundation in April 1999, the **“Award of Excellence”** by the Saskatchewan Healthcare Association in February 2002. For overall contribution to the people of Saskatchewan in particular, and to the people of Canada in general, the government of Saskatchewan presented me **“The Saskatchewan Order of Merit”** in October 2000. This is the highest civilian award offered by the government. **The Queen’s Golden Jubilee Medal**, presented in December 2002, for long term meritorious service in the healthcare field. For services to the community, was awarded the **Saskatchewan Centennial Medal** in September, 2005, and named **“Citizen of the Year”** by the CTV Network in December, 2005. To acknowledge Dr. Kumar’s various contributions to modern medicine, The Board of Canadian Medical Association at the annual meeting in August, 2006, unanimously voted to elect Dr. Kumar to **“Honorary Life Membership”**.

The City of Regina has also named a street after Dr Kumar in May, 2004.
